Question #1 • Text Response • 70 responses (80%) Which aspects of this class did you feel were intellectually or creatively stimulating?

Question #3 • Text Response • 67 responses (76%) Which aspects of this class could be improved to enhance your learning?

Results:

- I believe the slides could be improved. The amount of information on the slides can be extremely overwhelming. The professor also goes really fast during class. Slowing down, due to the amount of information that is being presented could be extremely helpful.
- I liked that there was closed captioning for the lectures, but I would always prefer if the lectures could be recorded for later use. Lecture slides serve the same purpose, but I find that seeing the actual lecture as it occurred is most helpful.
- I think some of the assignments could be improved because I felt like some of them were redundant in terms of information. In other words, I felt like some of the assignments were not necessary because they were excessive in the same information.
- The discussion sections could be less verbatim review, and more creatively oriented through games, opinion-based classroom discussion on the world's future (although that is admittedly very difficult at UCI given the rather silent students), etc.
- Despite the fact that the lectures contributed the most, I think the slides on the presentations shouldn't have so many words, to the point where students are somewhat discouraged to take notes, as well as the intense pacing of the lecturer.
- The amount of slides for lecture was a bit overwhelming. Looking back I probably have to study about forty slides each day of our lecture in the week which is a bit overwhelming since I have other classes to study for as well.
- I had only wished the content in each slides of the presentations were a bit smaller as there was quite of bit of information to get through, yet I can understand that each slide is jam packed with course material.
- I think he needs to put less information on the slides, choose a slide background that people can still see the text and be concise. We didn't complete the course material because he took to long.
- I think the length of some of the letters and material that wa covered could be shortened. Essentially only touching on the most key points and moving forward would help retain information easier.

I think if there was a study guide of the midterm and final, it would be helpful because we go over a lot of topics in the class so would be helpful to have a checklist of things to go over.
