That might be part of the nature of the class but it definitely would have improved my experience.

Also, I would kindly suggest a slower pace of lecture; I always feel like I'm scrambling to get


down all of the important information and can't really take it all in before we go onto the following slides.




Less lecture based classes or maybe adding a break in class to help everyone stay focused


